TREATING PALLIATIVE CARE PATIENTS IN PAIN WITH THE BODY TAMBURA A PROSPECTIVE CASE STUDY AT ST. JOSEPH'S HOSPICE FOR DYING DESTITUTE IN DINDIGUL/ SOUTH INDIA

Aprospective case study was carried out with patients of St.Joseph's hospice for Dying destitute in Dindigul/Southindia. Patients were treated with a treatment at baseline and on the next day. Outcomes were measured quantitatively by using a numeric rating scale (0-10, 10 maximum intensity of pain felt) at baseline, directly a er treatment and at the day a er the treatment to determine the description of the intensity of the pain.

Ten patients (5 women and 5 men) participated in the study. e majority described the therapy as a pleasant experience. e pain intensity at baseline was reduced from $8.3 \pm SD$ 1.16 to 4.6 ± 1.52 at day one and from 4.6 ± 2.07 to 2.4 ± 1.58 at day two.
