The last 25 years have witnesses continued improvement in the survival of extremely low birth weight infants particularly in the industrialized nations of the world. is has been accompanied by a shi in attitudes to the provision of intensive care to infants regarded as being at the margins of viability. Intensive care is increasingly o ered to such infants with signi cant intra- and inter-country variations in outcomes. Infants of birth weight <500 g encapsulate the moral and ethical dilemmas of perinatal clinicians who struggle to balance the natural parental emotional desire for every e ort to be made to save their premature infants with the clinicians' uncertainty about the infant's prospects for survival and/or disability. It is di cult for
