The Hepatitis B virus remains a major public health problem worldwide, especially in developing Asian countries. Thousands of Thai children under 5 have HBV from mother-to-child transmission. 90% of HBV-infected infants develop hepatic cancer. Since 2017, Thai national guidelines recommend mothers with high viral load or HBeAg positivity use TDF to prevent HBV transmission to their children. However, many Thai mothers do not receive treatment to prevent mother-to-child transmission. This study evaluated Mother-to-Child Transmission rate and factors (MTCT). e_____
