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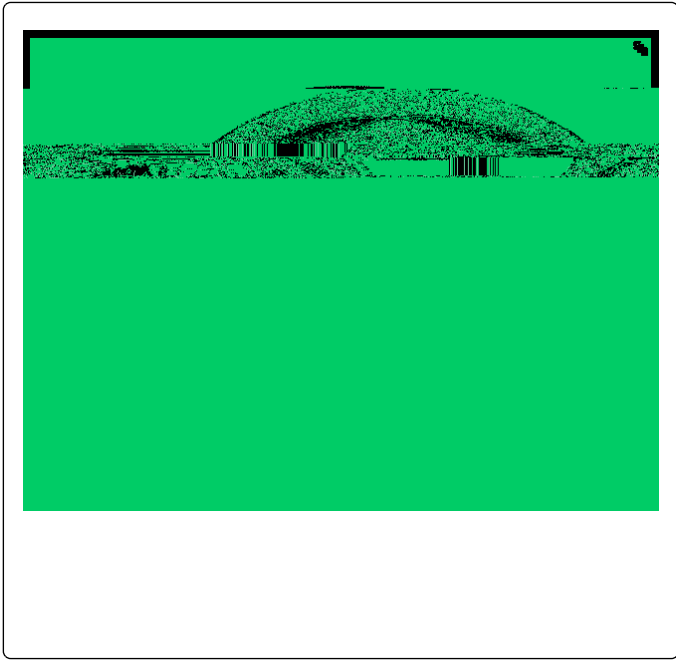
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## Abstract

Acute superior mesenteric vein thrombosis is an uncommon but life threatening disease condition. In the setting of antiphospholipid syndrome, it is rare.
