

An Unusual Variant of Cerebellopontine Angle Schwannoma in a Young Nepalese Girl

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Otherwise, schwannomas remain asymptomatic till it attains the huge size and produces features of raised intracranial pressure caused by obstructive hydrocephalus or multiple cranial nerve palsies displacing normal brain tissue. Brain structure is usually not invaded by the tumor but pushes the nearby normal brain tissue either up through incisura or down through the foramen magnum producing herniation.
