Despite the fact that women typically exhibit greater intrinsic work motivation, the study demonstrates that there is no signi cant di erence in work motivation between the genders. Our study had the following goals because work motivation is very important but there is no solid information that is relevant to occupational therapy: a) to ascertain the level of occupational therapy graduates in Malaysia who are motivated to work and b) to ascertain whether there is a distinction between occupational
