Conclusion

e burden of oral conditions was considerable among nursing home residents in an inner London borough. e main clinical issues related to the quality of dentures as well as to the high prevalence of tooth and root decay. Oral symptoms, such as dry mouth and toothache, were also very common and they were strongly associated with the residents worse OHRQoL.
