



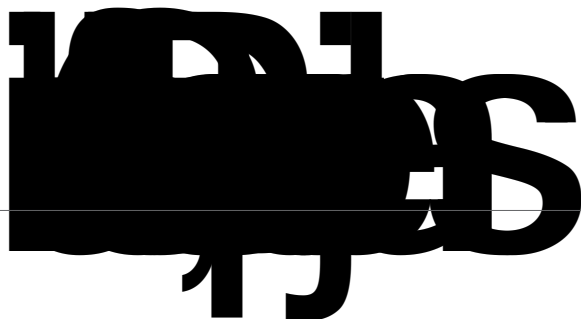
Neurological Complications Diseases of Epstein-Barr virus
