

Chronic Pelvic Pain in a Woman

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Case Report

60-year-old woman with a long history of chronic pelvic pain, characterized by severe, cyclical pain during menstruation and constant pain throughout the rest of the month. The pain was associated with dyspareunia and infertility. She had a long history of pelvic inflammatory disease (PID) and endometriosis, which were treated with various antibiotics and hormonal therapies. The pain was refractory to these treatments and significantly affected her quality of life. She had undergone multiple laparoscopic surgeries for endometriosis and PID, but the pain persisted. The patient was referred to our institution for further evaluation and management.

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
